The Green/Duwamish Watershed is a diverse place encompassing a vast array of people, natural features, and constructed environments. Municipalities in the watershed are shown here, where the vast majority of people reside, as well as their proximity to natural features and recreational amenities. Natural features include the main stem Green and Duwamish Rivers and their major tributaries as well as lakes and the marine shoreline. Recreational amenities shown include local and urban trails as well as urban, rural, and state parks. Conserved lands are also shown (as open space), including both actively managed resource lands as well as those in passive conservation, which help facilitate healthy functioning of the watershed's many systems.
